- 1 That Roffact here, on de la Couronne go under the Contract of Gerrard's for the Survey of the City, of many more, remains after the final completion of the Contract.
- 2 That the City Engineer be authorized to examine and report upon the Petition of William & Son for the heating of the City Hall and upon the petition of Robert Sander et al for the widening of a portion of Hamilton Street.
- 3 That a drain be sunk on Powell Street near Block 41 to prevent the water from running over the adjoining property at a cost of about \$10⁰⁰.
- 4 That ditches be dug at the South end of Granville Street and some of the large roots removed to make it possible but nothing further, as grading at this time of the year would make such street impassable.
- 5 That Mrs Lucas be notified that a crossing will be constructed at the corner of Thurlow and Georgia Streets.
- 6 That the sidewalk on Carl Avenue be continued from Oppenheimer Street to Prince Street.
- 7 That a crossing be put on Waterman Avenue opposite the sidewalk on Harris Street.
- 8 That the lane in Block 13, 196 be graded about half way through cost about \$5⁰⁰.
