The Council met on Tuesday February 2nd 1892.

The following Report was submitted by the J. W. C. Committee:

The Committee report they have received and opened 32 tenders for water works supplies and would recommend that the tender of Messrs Bell, Irving and Paterson for cast iron pipe at \$38.25 per ton, and special castings at \$60.20 per ton be accepted, also the tender of Mr. Carl of Victoria for pig lead at \$68.04 per ton and lead pipe at \$100.81 per ton be accepted.

The matter of values and hydrants the Committee have not yet been able to come to a decision.

They would recommend the lowest price tenders be retained, and the remaining tenders the cheques be returned.
