

Vancouver July 9th 1892.

A Special Meeting of the Councils of New West-
minster and Vancouver was held on Saturday July
9th 1892.

Present: His Worship the Mayor and full Council of
Vancouver and His Worship Mayor Townsend and Alder-
men Kennedy, Smith, & Hoy, and Dr. DeWolf Smith,
Medical Health Officer.

The object of the Meeting was to consider what action should
be taken to prevent the spread of small pox from
Victoria and other suspected ports,
Moved by Alderman Edlin.

Seconded by " Smith.

That the Government be urged
to form a Provincial Board of Health to adopt
at once the most effective course possible for the
protection of the people against the spread of small
pox and further resolved that the Government be
asked to answer by reply in its decision in this
matter when reached so that the Cities of Vancouver
and New Westminster may know what course to
adopt.

Carried.

Moved by Alderman Kelgus

Seconded by " Kennedy,

That passengers arriving from in-
fected districts by vessel in the City produce
certificates of recent vaccination or submit
to vaccination before being allowed to land,
and that the Health Officer appointed by the City
be requested to examine every vessel entering
and take whatever steps may be considered ne-
cessary, and further that a copy of this Resolution
be sent to each Steamboat Company the vessels
of which call at the City.
