

Vancouver March 1st, 1887

A Special Meeting of the Council was held
on Tuesday March 1st, 1887 at 2 P.M. a few
attendance being present.

Moved by Alderman Isaac Oppenheimer
seconded by Alderman Humphries,

Whereas it appears from the reports
in the public press that special legislation previ-
ously amending the powers given to this Council
to make and enforce laws for the government and
good order of the community and placing the police
management of the City under the control of persons
not responsible to the Corporation at an enormous
expense to this City and its inhabitants.

Therefore be it resolved that
this Council respectfully represent to His Honor the
Lieutenant-Governor in Council of this Province
that no special legislation for the protection of life
or property in this City is necessary and that the pow-
ers in the hands of the authorities are ample for our
protection and will be used when required.

And this Council being pre-
pared to take all steps for the enforcement of the
laws for the protection of persons of all nationalities
who come to Vancouver we respectfully request
that the Lieutenant-Governor in Council will ex-
pressly take no further steps to enforce the Chinese
Act until the Mayor and Council have shown them-
selves unable and unwilling to enforce the law.

Resolved Be it further
resolved that a copy of this resolution be at once
forwarded to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor
in Council.

Carried.

Moved by Alderman Mannion
seconded by Alderman Isaac Oppenheimer.

Moved by Alderman D. Oppenheimer seconded by
Alderman Alexander

That the Police Commissioners
be authorized to swear in twenty additional police
and that their salaries be fixed at \$2.25 per day
Carried.
