The Health Inspector

a decision in the matter until he had

The Board feel that this action on the part of the Police Magistrate was unwarranted as the Health Inspector is thereby hampered in the performance of his duties.

Mr. Crowley, the Night-Sewerage having failed to fulfil his duties we recommend that W. W. Ayer be appointed to the position and that he be required to furnish bonds forthwith.

Fire Brigade.
