The Board of Works.

The Board of Works met on Friday July 8<sup>th</sup> 1887 and report that they have received

a communication from Messrs Coor. and Sweet-asking permission to use a portion of Abbott Street for building material; we recommend that their petition be granted on their depositing with the City Engineer twenty dollars as a guarantee that they will replace the street in as good a condition as they found it.

We have instructed the City Engineer to examine and report as to the condition of the Cemetery and to see that the terms of Messrs Stephenson and McCrany's contract have been complied.

The communications of Mr. Cambie and Messrs Leamy and Hyle re the improvement of Georgia, Cambie and Smith Streets have been referred to the City Engineer to examine and report upon.

We recommend that Edward Mohan be instructed to prepare plans for an extension of the sewerage system between Appenheimer and Alexander Streets east of Westminster Avenue, to the district between Hastings, Cordova, Cambie and Howe Streets and between Hastings, Bender, Homer and Granville Streets, and between Hastings and Dupont Streets.

We also recommend that he be paid \$150<sup>00</sup>/<sub>100</sub> on account.

The consideration of the petition for 7th Avenue was laid over for one week.
