We recommend that the contract for Granville Street be awarded

to McDonald and Cameron; Cambel
Street to Tom Harkins; Park Avenue
and Johnston Street to Henry Bowers;
Georgia Street to Tom Harkins,
Seventh Avenue to W. H. McDonald
Fire Hall to McDonald & Holden
and pointing to A. J. Mardo.

The City Engineer has been
instructed to examine and report upon
Eveligh Street and Westminister
Sixth, Seventh and Eighth Avenues.

We recommend that tenders
be called for the improvement of Oppenheimer
Street and Carl and Jackson
Avenues, and the delivering of \$19,000 Cords
of gravel on the streets in the City; also that
the City Engineer be instructed to have that
portion of Water Street between Cambel
and Barrett Street graded and filled

Water Street up at once at a cost not exceeding
to be filled of \$30,000.

Progress estimate in favor of
Tom Harkins, amounting to \$581.00, is
attached, and recommended for
payment.

recommend that S. X. Metten be awarded
the contract for supplying groceries,
Hayes & McIntosh for meat; D. J. Campbell
for bread and J. H. Green for milk;

We would recommend
that a Medical Health Officer and
Hospital Assistant be appointed at a
salary of \$25⁰⁰ a month for the remainder
of the year and that applications be invited
for the drawing up of plans and specifications
for the erection of a City Hospital to cost
\$20,000⁰⁰, the architect to be paid 5% on
\$4,000⁰⁰, the amount we would recom-
mend to be expended at present, for
superintending the constructing of the
building and for preparing the plans
and specifications.
