Electric Light

We have received three propositions for the lighting up of the City for the ensuing year as follows:

No 1.

The Vancouver Electric Light Co. will furnish 60 Arc Lights of 2000 Candle Power at 70 cents each per night on condition that the City binds itself to take the lights for five years.

No 2.

The Vancouver Electric Illuminating Co. will furnish 60 Arc Lights of 2000 Candle Power, each at 60 Cents each per night.

No 3.

The Vancouver Electric Illuminating Co. will furnish 60 lights of 37 Candle power each at \$4.25 each per month.

the whole telephone service.

mittee.
- III. That it is not to the interest of the City
to continue the present system it being
entirely in disuse for street-lighting.
