

Sanctuary April 19th 1874

The Council met on Thursday April 19th 1874 at 8 P.M.
 Present: Aldermen Salisbury, Shaw, Innes, McPhail, Mc
 Craney, McPhaiden, Wm Brown, Franklin, C. L. Brown,
 and Bethune.
 Alderman C. L. Brown was appointed Chairman
 in the absence of the Mayor.

A deputation from the Street Railway Co and bond
 holders of the Co were present: consisting of Messrs
 Wm Murray, Wm Farrell, R. G. Jettow and Hutchinsons
 After considerable discussion re Powell Street track
 it was moved by

Alderman Wm Brown

Seconded by Alderman Franklin

That proceedings be taken to have the fran-
 chise granted the Company over that portion of Powell
 Street from Westminster Avenue to Campbell Avenue
 declared forfeited and the Company remove the track
 from that portion of the Street.

Moved in amendment by Alderman McCraney

Seconded by Alderman McPhaiden.

That the Street Railway Co or the legal repre-
 sentatives of the be instructed to at once place the
 present Powell Street track on the proper street grade
 and to place their portion of the Street in a thorough
 state of repair and to the entire satisfaction to the City
 Engineer.

Motion Carried.

The Council went into Committee of the whole for the consideration of the Estimates, Alderman Salisbury in the Chair.

After discussing the Estimates to some length the ^{Council} rose to report progress and asked leave to sit again.
