The Board of Works met on November 1st 1894,
 present Aldermen Macfarlane, Green, Hamilton and
 G. Brown

A deputation consisting of Messrs J. C. Keith, Johnson
 Spinks, C. E. Hope, and several others waited on the
 Board to discuss the question of opening up the streets
 west of Nicola Street under the local improvement
 plan, the matter having been referred back to the
 Board by the Council.

It was resolved that the resolution passed by the
 Board on the 18th of October namely "That this
 Board recommends that the portion of District
 Lot 185 lying west of Nicola Street be opened
 from water to water under the Local Improvement
 plan" be again referred to the City Council for
 consideration.

Messrs Peters and Ross applied personally for access
 to two new houses erected by them on 12th Av west of
 Manitoba Street.

Resolved that they be granted a 2 plank walk
 to be laid on 12th Av from Manitoba Street to the
 houses referred to.

R. H. Johnson wrote stating that the lane in rear
 of his fence has been cut so deep as to cause the
 fence to subside.

Referred to the City Engineer to examine and report
 from C. E. Barber complaining about the crossing
 laid down on Ross Street east of Jarvis Street and
 asking that 66 feet of sidewalk be laid from

the S. E. corner of Hars and Jones passing the front
of Lot 7. Block 33. 1851

Resolved that Mr. ~~Barstow~~ be notified that the
crossing he refers to is only a temporary one.

From Jonathan Miller applying to have the bond
for the cement sidewalk laid down in front of the
Miller Block dated back as the sidewalk has al-
ready been laid down one year.

Laid over pending the City Engineer's reply
to the question relating to this sidewalk put by
Alderman Franklin at the Council meeting.

Resolved that the Street Inspector be instructed to see
that the temporary sidewalk of old plank is put
down on Washburner Road to Mr. Sherdole's pro-
mises.

In reference to a question put by Alderman Franklin
at the Council meeting relating to the depth of the
basement drain on Granite Street, at Mr. Browning's
building, the Engineer submitted the contract draw-
ings and explained that the contractor for the
building by connecting with the wrong 'Y' led
from a foot to a foot and a half in fall.
