 Calling attention to the fact that the two last
 payments due on his account had not been
 settled; also from the Department of Agriculture
 stating that it was the intention of the Minister

to ask Council for authority to make an appropriation to the extent of \$1000⁰⁰ for the support of the papers through the Municipal Councils of Victoria and Vancouver respectively.

The whole question was referred to Alderman Salisbury to take whatever action he may deem necessary in the matter.

That the caretaker of the Isolation Hospital, be in future paid \$35.00 per month (dating from the 1st of October) with wages at the old rate when there are any patients in the Hospital, that he have the use of the land for gardening purposes conditional on him clearing the balance of the grounds and fencing it in, the City to supply the material for the fence; also that he be required to have, or supervision over the race course, and report from time to time.

From Miss Macfie, stating that she had appointed Mrs Stewart as assistant in the kitchen at the City Hospital at \$15.00 a month (dating from the 1st of August);
