

Sauconee Sept 4th 1895.

The Council met on Wednesday September 4th 1895, at 7.30 P.M.

Present: His Worship, the Mayor and full Board of Aldermen.

On motion the Council adjourned for half an hour to talk over matters informally.

On re-assembling it was moved by Alderman ^{Brown} Coupland, seconded by Alderman Gallagher, that the offices of Poll Tax Collector and Assessor be amalgamated, also the offices of Health Inspector & Plumbing Inspector and the Office of Milk Inspector & License Inspector.

That the Poll Tax Collector, Milk Inspector, Health Inspector and Plumbing Inspector be given 30 days notice that their services will not be required by the City after the said 30 days.

Moved by Alderman Gallagher,

Seconded by " Coupland,

That the Clerical work in the Water Works Department be turned over to the financial department.

Lost.

Moved by Alderman Clarendon,

Seconded by " Methuen,

That the Council proceed to ballot for the appointment of a Chief of Police.
