Vancouver December 3<sup>rd</sup> 1895

The Council met on Tuesday December 3<sup>rd</sup> 1895 at 10 A.M.

Present – His Worship, the Mayor and Aldermen Shaw, Coupland, Gallagher, Clandenning, Brown, Sanders, McDonald and Bethune. Captain Gandin, Agent for the Department of Marine and Fisheries laid before the Council several plans shewing where parties had made application for Foreshore rights on Burrard Inlet and False Creek.

After some discussion it was moved by Alderman Gallagher, Seconded by Alderman Brown

That His Worship, the Mayor appoint a Committee to take into consideration the applications of made by certain parties to the Dominion Government for Foreshore rights on False Creek and Burrard Inlet and to prepare a suitable memorial to be forwarded to the Government Agent in this matter; also to prepare a plan shewing the requests of the various applicants. Carried.

His Worship appointed the following Committee : Aldermen Shaw, Gallagher, Clandenning, Brown, and McDonald; also the City Solicitor and City Engineer.

The Board then adjourned.
