M. A. McLean appointed Vancouver's police magistrate – August 27, 1888

Former Vancouver Mayor M.A. McLean appointed Police Magistrate at a salary of \$1,000 per year. City Officials given an annual ten-day holiday. Fri Oct 12, 1888 set aside as Arbour Day, "for the purpose of planting trees and shrubs, and as a public holiday."

We have received three propositions for the lighting up of the City for the ensuing year as follows:

# No. 1

The Vancouver Eureka Electric Light Co will furnish 60 Arc Lights of 2000 candle power at 70 cts each per night on condition that the City binds itself to take the lights for five years.

#### No. 2

The Vancouver Electric Illuminating Co will furnish 60 Arc Lights of 2,000 candle power each at 60 cents each per night.

#### No. 3

The Vancouver Electric Illuminating Co will furnish 60 lights at 32 candle power each at \$4.25 each per month.

30 lights of candle power each at \$3.00 each per month.

Or

- 20 candle power lamps @ \$3.00 per month.

furnish two telephone free to the City in return for paying \$25.00 per month for night service it being considered that the amount is adequate to cover the whole telephone service.

The Chairman of the Fire, Water and Light Committee dissents from the recommendation of the Committee on the Electric Light question on the following grounds:

I. That the present Company has not sufficient power for the present lights.

II. That the Company gives no guarantee to increase its present power to enable it to carry out its offer to the Committee.

III. That it is not to the interest of the City to continue the present system - it being entirely in disuse for street lighting.

As it is advisable in the interest of the City to have a day to be known as Arbour Day, set apart in the Autumn of each year for the purpose of planting trees and shrubs and to be observed as a Public Holiday that His Worship, the Mayor be requested to proclaim Friday October 12th as Arbour Day for 1888. Carried.

Notice of Motion

Alderman Clark gave notice that at next regular meeting of Council he would introduce a By-Law for the purchase of Lots one to ten Block 12 corner of Westminster Avenue and Hastings Street for a public market and the appointment of a new Committee.

Alderman Lefevre gave notice that he would introduce a motion to discharge the committee appointed to select a suitable site for a public market and the appointment of a new committee.

The Council then adjourned.
