

Council for 1892 wraps up remaining business – January 16, 1893, 11:00 a.m.

The question of land for the Burrard Inlet and Fraser Valley Railway Co was referred to incoming Council. Final accounts from committees were approved, including an amount of \$6314.73 for school teachers' salaries. It was recommended that the annual reports of each Committee be printed.

Vancouver January 16th 1893

The Council met on Monday January 16th 1893 at 11 a.m.

Present. His Worship the Mayor, and Aldermen Anderson, Collins, Scoullar, McGuigan, McCraney, Franklin, Odlum, Mills and Gavin.

That the Communication from the Burrard Inlet and Fraser Valley Railway Co re the use of certain streets for railway purposes be laid over until, a proper profile is submitted showing the grades, at which it is proposed to build said railway on the streets referred to and such other information furnished, as may be necessary.
3. That the accounts presented by W H Baxters for material for repairs to the Rock Crusher amounting to £14.10s.8d be paid by the City and the amount deducted from Dr Kendall's accounts.

4. That the Finance Committee be asked to credit the Board of Works with the value of the crushed rock sold to private parties during 1892.
