The Council met on Wednesday September 7th 1892.

Present His Worship the Mayor and Aldermen Anderson, Collins, Scoullar, Franklin, Odlum and Mills.

The object of the meeting was to consider the granting of a bonus to the B. C. Iron Works Co. and other business.

After considerable discussion it was moved by Alderman Franklin Seconded by "Collins

That the B. C. Iron Works Co be granted a bonus of \$2,000 in 4 per cent debentures in consideration of their rebuilding and operating their works and agreeing to move off the road bed of Westminster avenue produced and paying the rent of the leased property until such time as it is required by the City for Street purposes after expropriation.

Carried.

Moved by Alderman Scoullar Seconded by "Franklin

That the following account be paid: Clements + Addison, Fences etc for Jockey Club Grounds.

Carried.

The Board then adjourned.
