Vancouver August 31st 1893.

The Council met on Thursday August 31st 1893.

Present His Worship the Mayor and Aldermen Anderson, Salsbury, Collins, Hackett, McCraney, Cargill Franklin, Hobson and Towler.

Communications

From J. Potts, asking permission to assign an interest in monies coming due on his sewer contracts to J. A. Fletts.

Referred to the City Solicitor.

From S. Tallman rendering an account for \$ for work done in connection with the City Hospital.

Moved by Alderman Collins

Seconded by " Towler

That the amount be paid.

Carried

From C. G. Fanquer, asking for a reply to his communication re bridge over the narrows.

Referred to the Clerk of the F. W+L Committee for reply.

The following Report was again taken up:-

To the Mayor + Aldermen

Your Special Committee appointed at last Council meeting recommends as follows:-

That the C. P. R. Co. be exempted from taxation on the grounds and depot to be enacted thereon at the foot of Granville Street for the sum of 20 years provided the same is completed ready for occupation on or before the 31st day of December 1894.

Consideration of By-Laws

Moved by Alderman McCraney
Seconded by "Collins

That the By-Law to change the names of Oppenheimer St. + Carl Av. be read a second time.

Carried.

The Council went into Committee of the Whole for the consideration of the By Laws with Alderman Salsbury in the Chair.

The By-Law was read over clause by clause, and reported to Council as complete.

It was then read a 3rd time on motion of Alderman McCraney seconded by Alderman Franklin.

The Council then adjourned.
