The question of the expenditure of the \$250 to be paid over by the Street Railway for the fixing up of Robson Street was discussed.

Resolved that the work be done under the supervision of the Ward Foreman and the instructions of the City Engineer it being understood that this work shall not interfere with the ordinary work.

Resolved that the loose rock at the South end of Granville Street be covered with ashes from Hotel Vancouver.

Resolved also that the bank on Granville Street between Davie and Drake Streets be re-planked by the Ward men it being in a dangerous condition.
