The Council met on Monday June 3<sup>rd</sup> 1901 at 7.30 P.M.  
Present His Worship the Mayor and Aldermen Grant, Painter, Neelands, Cook, McPhaiden, McGuigan, Foreman and Wood.  
The Minutes of last meeting were read and adopted.

1. A By-Law to raise \$60000 for Water Works purposes
2. By-Law to raise 20000 for Cemetery purposes
3. By-Law to raise 11000 for Stone Quarry purposes
4. By-Law to raise 28000 for Jail purposes
5. By-Law to raise 48000 for fire halls etc
6. By-Law to authorize the disposal of certain lands.

That the Rules be again suspended and the By-Law read a second time

Carried.

The By-Law was accordingly read a second time

Moved by Alderman Painter

That the Music Hall Polling By-Law be read a Second time

Carried

The By-Law was accordingly read a second time.

Moved by Alderman Painter

Seconded by Alderman McPhaiden

That the By-Law to provide a fee for a Music Hall license be read a second time.

Carried

The By-Law was accordingly read a second time.

Yeas Aldermen Painter, McGuigan, McPhaiden and Wood.

Nays Aldermen Grant, Neelands, Cook and Foreman

The Mayor voted yea.

The Council went into Committee of the Whole for the consideration of the By-Law with Alderman Wood in the Chair.

The By-Law was considered clause by clause and reported complete.

The third reading was postponed until after a vote of the electors was taken thereon.

The Council went into Committee of the Whole for the consideration of the By-Law to fix the Polling Places etc for the Music Hall By-Law and on the By-Law to fix the Polling Places etc on the money By-Laws.

Each By-Law was read over clause by clause and reported to Council as complete without amendment.

The Rules were suspended and both By-Laws read a 3rd time on motion of Alderman Neelands. Seconded by Alderman McGuigan.

Seconded by Alderman McPhaiden

That the Council go into Committee of the Whole for the consideration of the By-Law to raise \$28000 for Jail purposes.

Carried

Alderman Wood was appointed Chairman

The By-Law was read over clause by clause after which the committee rose and reported the same complete.

Moved by Alderman McGuigan

Seconded by Alderman Foreman

That the Council go into Committee of the Whole for the consideration of the By-Law to raise \$20000 for Cemetery purposes.

Carried

Alderman McGuigan was appointed Chairman

The By-Law was read over clause by clause and reported to Council as complete

Moved by Alderman Painter

Seconded by Alderman Wood

That the By-Law to raise \$ [amount not indicated] for bathing beach purposes be read a 2<sup>nd</sup> time

Moved in amendment by Alderman Neelands

Seconded by Alderman Cook

That the second reading of the By-Law be indefinitely postponed

Amendment carried, motion lost

Moved by Alderman Grant

Seconded by Alderman Painter

That the By-Law to raise \$11000 for the acquiring of a Stone quarry be read a 2<sup>nd</sup> time.

Carried

The Council went into Committee of the Whole for its consideration with Alderman Grant in the Chair.

The By-Law was read over clause by clause and reported to the Council as complete.

The By-Law was read over clause by clause and reported to the Council as complete.

Seconded by Alderman McGuigan

That the Council go into Committee of the Whole to consider the By-Law empowering the

Council to sell certain lands.

Carried.

Alderman Neelands was appointed Chairman

The By-Law was read over clause by clause and reported to the Council as complete.

Moved by Alderman Wood,

Seconded by Alderman McPhaiden,

That the Council go into Committee of the Whole for the consideration of the By-Law to raise \$48000 for the acquiring of Fire Halls, etc

Carried

Alderman Wood was appointed Chairman

The By-Law was read over clause by clause and reported to the Council as complete.
