The Council met on Monday, May 13, 1901

The Building Inspector was instructed not to interfere any further in the matter and that resolution would be presented at the next sitting of the Council.

Notice of Motion

Alderman Painter gave notice of his intention to introduce at the next sitting of the Council, a by-law to provide for the purchase and improvement of certain lots in Blocks 63 and 71, Sub. 185 fronting on English Bay to be used by the City for the purposes of bathing places and an esplanade

Alderman Neelands gave notice that at the next regular meeting of the Council he would move that the C.P.R. Co be requested to convey to the City a portion of land 80 by 120 ft as shewn [sic] and coloured red on plan produced, for a Free Library site.
The City to erect a Library building thereon under the condition of Mr Carnegie's offer.

The Council then adjourned.
