Resolved that a Special Committee consisting of the Mayor, Chairman and Aldermen M^cGuigan and Painter be appointed to examine the designs furnished by M^r Bloomfield and report at next meeting.

The Contract for Cemetery clearing was approved and authorized to be signed by the Mayor and City Clerk and the Corporate Seal affixed thereto.
