

A letter of condolence to the widow of Alderman Shaw was drafted. Offers from both the City Band and the Battery Band to perform at Alderman Shaw's funeral were discussed.

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Vancouver October 22nd 1900.

The Council met on Monday October 22nd 1900. Present His Worship, the Mayor and Aldermen Grant, McQueen, Neelands, McPhaiden, Foreman, Barker, Wood and Baxter. A letter of condolence drafted by the mayor and addressed to the widow of the late Alderman Shaw was read and endorsed by Council on motion of Alderman McQueen. Seconded by Alderman Barker.

Two Communications were received from the City and Battery Bands offering their services in connection with the funeral of the late Alderman Shaw. The Mayor explained that he had been tendered the services of the Battery Band before the offer was received from the City Band and had made arrangements accordingly. It was therefore moved by Alderman Grant, Seconded by Alderman McQueen that the offer of the Battery Band be accepted.
